Another very interesting report follows from the Committee who convened the "Small Family Gathering" held Saturday, 9th October, 1971.

Because of the fine work and generosity of members of the committee and that of the Rev David Livingstone of historic St Anne's Church, Hyde, the Gathering was able to take place.

The committee, of course, stood the initial expense for this first function as there had to be a beginning. However, it was all an amazing experience especially the beautiful service which pleased all faiths and tastes. Following the service the descendants of all ages crowded into the Church Hall for afternoon tea. There they were able to obtain undocumented copies of the first two generations born in Australia (all large families - and copies are available from the committee). On account of the crowd there was not sufficient time for everyone to sign the visitor's book. Suggestions are that we have a much expanded programme next time since such enthusiasm resulted. Although so many attended contact is needed with the remaining legions of relatives to commence listing the bare third generation.

We are much indebted to the Cutty Sark Sea Rangers of the District lead by Mrs. Douglas who, under great difficulties, together with those members of the family who supervised the kitchen arrangements &c &c all nobly saw us through the massive afternoon tea and also to those who took an active part in making the church service so delightful and impressive. The report is signed by Mr. W.J. Pollock, Chairman; Mrs. E.I.A. Cooke, Secretary; and Mr. C.D.G. Small, Treasurer. They and the other members of the committee, Messrs A.C. Small, P. Cambourn, D. Cakes, Madames I.A. Thompson, F. Denning, D. Upcroft, Misses E. Eridle, G. Small, and D. Whiting are all 4th or 5th generation descendants of John and Mary Small who were married in the colony on 12th October, 1788.

Since that day we are very sorry to learn of the death of Mr. Upcroft the husband of one of the committee members, Mrs. D. Upcroft. Our deepest sympathy is extended to Mrs. Upcroft and her family in their sad bereavement.
